## MESSAGE FROM THE MANSE

There was such a buzz on Easter Sunday. It was the first time that we had gathered together in-person in church to worship since Christmas. People were talking over the top of pews, waving to one another; children were running about the carpark afterwards. It was so encouraging to see our church family and to hear the building come alive with sound.

I believe that Covid-19 has made us forget that we are people who thrive on relationships. The most important and essential relationship we need to have is with God, and for many people lockdown has created space to grow that relationship. However, I fear that we have pulled away from other people; we have lifted the drawbridges and turned ourselves into islands. In John 13 v 34 Jesus says “Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other.” The word we translate as love means to care for each other, and one way we do that is meeting together to worship. When we physically gather, we can sing, pray and read and study the Bible together. We can also talk face to face (facemasks don’t stop that) and support one another.

The writer of Hebrews puts it this way in chapter 10 verse 25 “And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.”

Whilst it is possible to join church services by Facebook and YouTube, and we are thankful for these mechanisms over these last 15 months and now on an ongoing basis, being part of a combined togetherness on a Sunday service is so important. We appreciate that members may, for whatever reason, prefer to worship from home – but for those who are back out in the community at work, at shops and socialising, can I encourage you to make Sunday worship the next item on your list.

So let me challenge you that if you haven’t yet ventured back into church to do so. From a safety point of view, we have plenty of hand sanitiser, a one-way system, facemasks and social distancing all in place to protect everyone. May I encourage you to see beyond Covid-19 and to look into your own life and the lives of others, to realise how we can support one another as we meet together and have fellowship, to realise how we can be the vessel that God uses to be a shining light in our community.
